Tip and Tricks for Travelingon the Farm

To begin your time travel adventure, just step out the back doors of the interpretive center. Follow the path to the 1850 farm.

Each stop provides a clue to the time travelers phrase that will help you get back.

To help you explore the 1850s, you can ask the farm family for help.

Closely observe all the details of the farm:

- Crops they raised
- Food they raised for the family to eat
- What kinds of animals lived on the farm and what were their purposes
- What buildings are on the farm and what were they used for
- How did the family live without electricity
- Where did the family get water to drink, take a bath, wash clothing
- What did they wear
- What was the work they did



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Hint: Time Travel in the 1850s. The secret phrase is from author, Charles Dickens. BUT did you know that In 1843 he wrote a story called, A Christmas Carol, featuring time traveler, Ebenezer Scrooge.

If you're anything like us, when you first read Charles Dickens' famous tale of Ebenezer Scrooge, you didn't even think of it as a time travel story. But time travel it is — Scrooge travels through space and time, visiting both his past and his future. Sure, he's being lead about by ghosts, but the idea is the same — this greater understanding of the universe and the way things link to each other changes Scrooge's mind and actions.
